Highlights of the week

Snow Leopards

This week, Nursery have been using tweezers to refine their fine motor skills. They have been gripping cotton wool balls (clouds) and removing them to reveal the picture of the sunshine underneath (This has been the only sunshine we have seen all week!).

Panda Class

Reception pupils have been busy this week learning about doubles. They have all learnt the doubles of the numbers 1 to 5 and have shown impressive recall as the week progressed.
